## Reading to Understand the Ontario Driver's G1 Knowledge Test



### Course Overview

**Number of Units:** 5 Units

### Course Description

The first step to becoming a licensed driver in Ontario is passing the Written (Knowledge) Test. Do you have the reading skills to do well on the test? This course will help you prepare for the kinds of questions you might see. You will examine how to read the questions in order to answer them correctly. You will learn how to identify traffic signs and interpret diagrams. You will also learn about seatbelts, traffic signs, speed limits, meeting a school bus, the Demerit Point System, passing other vehicles and rules of the road.

### Unit 1

In this unit you will learn about the graduated licencing system and classifications that we use in Ontario. You will also learn about the process for applying for your licence, common vocabulary that you will come across while preparing for the G1 written test and traffic and regulatory signs.

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### Unit 2

In this unit you will learn about seatbelts, child safety and using your headlights. Emergency vehicle safety and warning traffic signs will also be covered.

### Unit 3

In this unit you will learn about road rules, parking, construction, temporary condition and high occupancy vehicle signs. A lesson on traffic lights is also included.

### Unit 4

In this unit you will learn about pavement markings, how to pass other vehicles, getting on and off a freeway, information and direction signs, meeting school buses and driving through intersections.

### Unit 5

In this unit you will learn about the different types of driver's licence suspensions, the demerit point system, collision reporting requirements, speed limits and sharing the road with others.
